The new site will focus on three main areas, beginning with an opportunity to learn more about civic education and our government. The We the People Open Course, a free, self-paced course that follows the *We the People: The Citizen & The Constitution* level 3 textbook, features videos of notable scholars and accompanying online exercises. Participants journey from the philosophical foundations of the U.S. Constitution through the modern interpretation and application of its ideals. This course is open to everyone.

A second feature of the site is the Civics Forum. Geared specifically to teachers, the forum provides a place to discuss civics and government, and share resources with teachers across the globe.
